REPORT DATE: January 8, 2022 RE: 2021 Overtime Hours

Since the start of the global pandemic, Brant County Health Unit personnel have been redeployed to monitor, detect, and contain COVID-19, while continuing to maintain critical public health programs and services.

During peak immunization periods, the Health Unit has employed a number of temporary contract employees to support the vaccine program, mitigating the need for overtime hours while providing time off relief for permanent employees.

From January 1 to December 31, 2021, the Health Unit unionized staff incurred 786 overtime hours including statutory holidays at 1.5 x hourly rate and 1,420 excess regular hours at 1.0 x hourly rate for a total cost of approximately \$105,584. Ministry extraordinary one-time funding will be sufficient to support these incremental staffing costs.

Brantford Brant Ontario Health Team (BBOHT) Update

On Monday December 13, 2021, a joint Board Meeting for the Board representatives of the BBOHT was held. Discussions included oversight of performance and financial management, strategic planning and the roll of governance, and joint board development. Board members also received updates on Ministry direction to work with the Norfolk OHT. The most recent BBOHT Newsletter outlining recent OHT activities is attached for information.

The BBOHT is currently meeting on a weekly basis to monitor the COVID pandemic response and impacts on the local health system partners and to coordinate responses where possible. Many OHT partners are currently experiencing severe Health Human Resources challenges due to staff absences and outbreaks.

City Budget Presentation

The Brant County Health Unit is scheduled to present the 2022 budget on Monday January 31. The budget summary information and presentation have been submitted to City staff.

COVID-19 Response

The significant number of cases of COVID -19 which have been reported in the last few weeks and the recent wide expansion of eligibility for COVID vaccine have placed significant demands on Health Unit resources. Staff have been redeployed to address COVID – 19 demands.



E-REFERRAL PILOT MAKES PROGRESS

Progress continues this month with the OCEAN eReferral pilot projects between the BGH Emergency Department and St. Paul's Clinic, as well as BGH Diagnostic Imaging. As these pilot projects continue to advance over the next few months, the focus will shift to further expanding the roll-out of OCEAN eReferral to even more Brantford health providers. The implementation and adoption of OCEAN eReferral is led by the eHealth Center of Excellent (eCE) and is 100% funded by the Ministry of Health! The BBOHT Digital Health Team in conjunction with the eCE will be scheduling OCEAN eReferral Demos and Q&A sessions for individual workgroups and organizations within the BBOHT. These demos will offer a glimpse into what the program has to offer our community partners, as well as to explore functionality and identify any barriers to success within the rollout plan.

The OCEAN information sessions come on the heels of a successful Digital Health Week (Nov 29 - Dec 5) where the BBOHT broadcast their digital health initiatives on social media. The main area of focus for Digital Health Week was the need for increased technology in the healthcare system in order to keep up in our rapidly evolving world. As implementation of OCEAN eReferral has been very slow in Brantford Brant, relative to other areas of the province, there is an enormous opportunity to quickly advance implementation and adoption.

The hope of the BBOHT Digital Health team is that the successful implementation of eReferral platforms such as OCEAN will help improve patient outcomes and ultimately the patient, and health provider experience in Brantford and Brant County.



PEDIATRIC ASSESSMENT CENTRE UPDATE

The Brantford Pediatric COVID-19 Assessment Centre is now fully operational at the site of the existing Brantford COVID-19 Assessment Centre (79 Market Street S). This clinic provides a convenient and safe option for children and their families who may require a COVID test as well as physician support in managing mild viral symptoms.

The clinic has been fully operation now for six weeks and sees an average 5-6 patients per day, 7 days per week. This has been very helpful in alleviating pressure on primary care and Emergency Departments to see those who may otherwise be left without appointments due to COVID-19 screening protocols.

FLU SHOT & COVID VACCINE OUTREACH

The BBOHT Homelessness Team is working with community partners to increase the availability of COVID-19 vaccines (first and second doses) and influenza vaccines for those in our community experiencing homelessness. An outreach response is being implemented to extend vaccination services into the community where homeless clientele typically access other services such as meal programs and outreach support. The Brantford Downtown Outreach Team (St. Leonard's Community Services and Grand River Community Health Centre), Brantford EMS and the Brant County Health Unit are working to offer vaccines via mobile clinics in January. Health cards will be recommended but not required. Additional outreach services will be provided, including primary care services and winter warmth support.

RE: COVID Immunization Report

The COVID-19 immunization program has been extremely busy as vaccine clinics have been ramped up to the extent of Health Unit staffing capacity.

The number of groups eligible for booster doses has been expanded over the last few weeks and now includes the following populations:

- Children 5 to 11 years of age are eligible to receive their first doses and second doses after a recommended interval of eight weeks of the recently-approved pediatric Pfizer vaccine. These children are not yet eligible for booster doses.
- Youth 12 to 17 years of age are also eligible for their first and second doses at the same interval with the approved adult Pfizer vaccine. They are also not yet eligible for booster doses.
- Adults 18+ years of age are now eligible for their third dose of vaccine or booster dose at a recommended minimum interval of 3 months following their second dose.
- Fourth doses have also been recommended for all residents of Long-Term Care Homes, Retirement Homes, Elder Care Lodges and other congregate settings for seniors. Fourth doses are also recommended for some specific immunocompromised populations.
- Children less than 5 years of age are currently not eligible for immunization as vaccines for these children have not yet been approved.

To facilitate access for local residents, walk-ins are accepted for all first and second doses including for children and youth. Additional walk-in clinics have been provided for those local residents who are 60+ years of age. Walk-in clinics will also be held for additional groups such as lower-age bands and higher-risk or vulnerable groups such as pregnant women. Special clinics where also held for local education and day care staff. Future mobile clinics are being planned for Long-Term Care and Retirement Homes.
